

Children's memory work for 4th quarter (Dec., Jan., Feb.) Catechism Cards 79-91

Bolded sections are a briefer option for younger children.

Week 1—Catechism Cards 79-80 (to be quoted on December 4)	
What is meant by the words, <i>until He comes</i> , which are used by the Apostle Paul when observing the Lord's Table?	The words, <i>until He comes</i> , teach us indisputably that our Lord Jesus Christ will come a second time . This is the joy and blessed hope of all believers.
In what manner will our Lord come?	Our Lord will come personally, bodily, visibly, and gloriously.

In what manner will our Lord come?	Our Lord will come personally, bodily, visibly, and gloriously.

What will happen to those left behind after we are raptured?	Those left behind after we are raptured will enter into a period of seven literal years of terrifying, catastrophic ordeals of the wrath of God and of the Lamb.
How will the seven years of God's wrath terminate?	The seven years of God's wrath will terminate with our Lord's return to earth to rule and reign.
Week 7—Catechism Cards 86-87 (to be quoted on January 29)	
How will the seven years of God's wrath terminate?	The seven years of God's wrath will terminate with our Lord's return to earth to rule and reign.
How long will our Lord rule and reign upon the earth?	Our Lord will rule and reign upon the earth for a thousand literal years.

Week 11—Catechism Card 91 (to be quoted on February 26)	
Finally, Christians, what shall be the eternal end?	The eternal end shall be that God shall be all in all, that the Lamb shall be served by us who see His face, and that these Divine Persons shall receive from every created thing blessing and honor, glory and power, dominion and praise forever and ever. Amen, and Amen.
