Suggested "Bare Basics" Methodology

1. Begin your day with prayer.

- a. Repent of daily sin. (attitudes and frustrations)
- b. Cast all your cares upon Him. (I Peter 5:7)
- c. ASK. (For everyone that asks, receives . . . Matthew 7:8)

4. Memorization—HUGE spiritual benefit, because it forces meditation and brings comfort and stability and ammunition against Satanic attack.

5. Prayer Journals—provide amazing spiritual encouragement to see how God answers your own prayers.
