

## How does Christ execute the office of a priest?

Therefore, He had to be made like His brethren in all things, so that He might become a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people (NASB; Heb. 2:17).

But He, having offered one sacrifice for sins for all time, SAT DOWN AT THE RIGHT HAND OF GOD (NASB; Heb. 10:12).

But Jesus, . . . because He continues forever, holds His priest-hood permanently. Therefore He is able also to save forever those who draw near to God through Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them (NASB; Heb. 7:24-25).

Christ executes the office of a priest in offering up Himself as the once-for-all sacrifice to satisfy Divine justice and reconcile us to God, and in making continual intercession for us.
