How do we know that God exists in three persons?

... baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit (NASB; Matt. 28:19).

... God sent forth <u>His Son</u>, born of a woman, born under the Law, so that He might redeem those who were under the Law, that we might receive the adoption as sons. Because you are sons, God has sent forth <u>the Spirit of</u> <u>His Son</u> into our hearts, crying, "Abba! <u>Father</u>!" (NASB; Gal. 4:4-6; compare Rom. 8:15). We know that God exists in three persons because they are distinguished in Scripture by their personal relations with one another and by their distinctive works.

Question: What are two of the distinctive works of each of the persons of the Godhead?
