

Ministry to the Young | *Nursery & Frontline*

Nursery (during scheduled services) — Because the Lord has blessed our church with many children ages 0-2, we need many helpers in our nurseries. Most workers serve once or twice a month. We ask that all mothers who use the nursery for their children work at least once a month.

We have four different nurseries:

- Infants (0-6 mos)
- Crawlers (6-11 mos)
- Early Walkers (12-23 mos)
- Advanced Walkers (24-35 mos)

In a given month, approximately 280 time slots must be filled – many more than our parents alone can fill. Because of the number of nurseries and the number of services we have, we ask that every lady who is a member of our assembly consider this ministry. If everyone helps, no one will need to miss too many services.

Various roles are available:

- **Hostess:** An experienced worker, greets the parents at the nursery entrance, and makes sure instructions are followed.
- **Workers:** One to four other workers (not necessarily less experienced) support the hostess and help make sure all the babies' needs are met.
 - Ladies, ages 16 and above, help in the Infant and Crawler nurseries.
 - Girls and Ladies, ages 12 and above, help in the Walker nurseries.
 - Everyone who works in the nursery must be a member of our church with two exceptions:
 - 12-18 year old girls who are daughters of our members
 - University girls whose membership is in a church back home

If you are interested in helping, contact one of the nursery supervisors:

You must complete an application, read a handbook, and watch a safety DVD. The application (found on the desk in the hallway next to the nursery) should be returned to Valorie Barnett or the church office. The handbooks can be found at each nursery station. The DVD can be checked out from the church office.

A new nursery schedule is available every quarter, so depending on when you volunteer, you may not be given a permanent position immediately. You may be put on a substitute list until the new schedule is printed.

Frontline Clubs (Saturday mornings) – Frontline aims to aid Bible-memory and spiritual growth in children (ages 3-6th grade). The club meets on most Saturday mornings during the school year from 9:30-11:30 a.m.

Ladies either serve as class workers in one of the five age groups or as a nursery worker, tending to the young children of those helping with Frontline.

Ministry in Activity Planning | *Church Events*

Ministry to the Needy | *Beneficence Ministry*

Beneficence is defined as a “quality of charity or kindness,” or “a charitable act or gift.” In Matthew 10:42 our Lord says that whoever gives His disciples even a cup of cold water to drink shall be rewarded. The Beneficence Ministry is one of our opportunities to do this.

Of course spontaneous acts of beneficence are the nicest ones of all, but we're not always aware of others' needs, so Mount Calvary has organized the Beneficence Ministry. This ministry provides meals (and occasionally other services, such as babysitting or housecleaning) for those within the church family in time of special need (births, illness, surgery, etc.) The ultimate goal of this ministry is twofold: (1) to encourage, edify, and materially assist those within the congregation who are in need, for the pleasure and glory of God, and (2) to give God's people an opportunity to extend themselves to others.

But do not forget to do good and to share, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased.
(Hebrews 13:16)

As we have, therefore, opportunity, let us do good unto all, especially unto them who are of the household of faith. (Galatians 6:10)

Much of this provided ministry is what our ladies specialize in and can easily do. So this ministry is open to every lady in the church.

The Beneficence Ministry is organized through the Sunday school classes. In the smaller setting of Sunday school, our elders and deacons attempt to practice watch care over those entrusted to their care in the classes. If an individual has a need, the Sunday school class, under the direction of the elder and deacon, first tries to meet that need from within that class. If the need is larger than one class can handle, additional classes may be called on to participate. When a new cycle of Sunday school begins, a sign of sheet is circulated in each of the classes. On it you can specify which services you are able to provide. When a need arises, your deacon's wife will call you to see if you are in a position to help. If a need arises in a brother or sister who is not in a Sunday school class, you can notify **Pastor Tipton** or the church office to follow up on it.

Ministry to our Missionary Families | *LMPG & Hospitality*

Our ladies have opportunity to minister in specific ways to our missionary families spread all over the world. We minister to our missionaries while they are on the field (Ladies Missionary Prayer Group) and often when they are home on furlough (Missions Hospitality).

Ladies Missionary Prayer Group (LMPG): LMPG is a ministry that meets regularly throughout the year (once a month) to focus prayer on behalf of our missionaries and to assist them with specific projects.

LMPG Officers:

The *President* chooses the theme and focus for the year, fills the appointed positions, proposes a budget, leads the monthly meetings, conducts quarterly officers' meetings, makes church-wide verbal announcements for LMPG, and oversees the smooth running of the organization.

The *Vice President* arranges the speaker schedule, introduces the speaker at the monthly meetings, updates prayer folders and oversees the evening prayer time, and updates the bimonthly missionary prayer requests made available church-wide.

The *Librarian* promotes the reading of missionary biographies through a monthly book report and coordination of checking books in and out from LMPG's library.

The *Public Relations* officer writes the weekly missionary prayer request update for the Sunday worship guide, posts those updates on the MCBC's website, and coordinates all written announcements, invitations and posters regarding LMPG.

The *Treasurer* collects the monthly offering and pays expenses for LMPG.

The *Correspondence Secretary* sends birthday, Christmas, and special occasion cards, mails packages, and emails a bimonthly newsletter to our missionaries.

The *Recording Secretary* keeps attendance records for the purpose of determining eligibility for holding leadership positions as outlined in LMPG's constitution.

The *Project Coordinator* chooses a gift to give or project to do for each missionary, purchases and sends the gift, and coordinates project nights.

Appointed Positions:

The *Chorister* chooses and leads a song at the beginning of each meeting.

The *Pianist* plays a short prelude and the opening song.

The *Sound System Coordinator* ensures that all the necessary equipment is setup for the meeting and records each speaker.

The *Nursery Coordinator* arranges for volunteers to work in the nursery for each meeting.

The *Refreshment Committee Chair* organizes volunteers to bring refreshments, serve food and clean up afterward.

The *Prayer Group Assistant* helps the Vice President update the missionary prayer folders.

Two *Prayer Group Leaders* direct the prayer time for our girls: Bettie Dreisbach Little Girls, and Bettie Dreisbach Young Girls.

Missionary Hospitality Committee – The committee exists primarily to help meet the needs of our missionaries when they return to the States for furlough. Needs vary from missionary to missionary, and we seek to adapt to their needs. Some of the ways that we may help are:

- Arranging for temporary housing
- Providing meals and food upon their arrival so the missionary does not have to run to the grocery store the first day or two back
- Cleaning the home where the missionary will stay on furlough
- Gathering needed household items
- Organizing a food pounding
- Purchasing grocery store gift cards
- Helping with unpacking or moving in
- Arranging for help with children during moving

Our ladies are encouraged to register their interest in helping either by contacting Pam Freeman or by signing-up when the beneficence sign-ups are passed around in Sunday school. Specific columns are designated for Missionary Hospitality, and those indicating availability will be contacted as needs arise.
