Light—*Romans* 13:11-14

- 1. Employs a significant biblical metaphor
- 2. Declares moral purity to be one necessary response to God's saving mercies (12:1)
- 3. Pinpoints part of what it means to present our bodies a living sacrifice, not conformed but transformed by the renewing of our minds (12:2)
- 4. Comes on the heels of Paul's exhortation to owe nobody anything except to fulfill the law through neighborly love (13:8-10)
- 5. Urges spiritual alertness in light of Christ's return (13:11)

Light—*Romans* 13:11-14

- 6. Depicts evil in terms of what transpires in the dark and good in terms of what happens only by means of the armor of light (13:12)
- 7. Commands us in undiluted terms (13:13)
- 8. Reminds us that sexual sin doesn't stand alone (13:13)
- 9. Directs us to the singular salvation of Jesus Christ (13:14a)
- 10. Exhorts us not to make provision for our flesh (13:14b)

Loving Your Wife

- 1. Assess your love in 1 Corinthians 13 terms.
- 2. Pray with your wife. Let her know how she can pray for you.
- 3. Don't position your wife as your primary accountability partner.
- 4. If applicable, confess your sin to her, perhaps with a mature third person.
- 5. Apply radical amputation and solid accountability.
