David's Life in the Psalms Lesson 2-David Exalts and Exhorts: Psalm 34

#### Introduction

- The Psalm expresses the experience of a saint and the prayerful throbbing of a heart moved to serve God.
- Our problem many times is not our lack of knowledge of what is right, but our lack of \_\_\_\_\_\_ to do what is right.
- The Psalms stir our religious to make us want to obey God whole-heartedly, protecting us from cold intellectualism.

#### David the Madman

- David wrote Psalm 34 after the story recorded in 1 Sam. 21:10-15.
- Ironically, David had just picked up \_\_\_\_\_\_ sword from Ahimelech before he entered the land of the Philistines.
- David was fearful of Abimelech, probably a title for King\_\_\_\_\_.
- This was a very low point in David's life.
  - He had just parted with Jonathan
  - He had no food or protection
  - He was alone in the cave of Adullam
- $\Leftrightarrow$  As David reflected on this event in Psalm 34, he did not focus on his

clever\_\_\_\_\_, but on God's protection.

### David Exalts

- David begins the Psalm by praising God continually himself and then invites others to join him in his worship.
- $\updownarrow$  David was not bashful when sharing his spiritual \_\_\_\_\_.
- The Angel of the Lord's protection in verse 7 is illustrated in the story of \_\_\_\_\_.
- David exalts in God's deliverance from fear (verse 4), from enemies (verse 7), and from trouble (verse 17)

## David Exhorts

- $\overset{\mbox{\scriptsize (The rewards of virtue are the baits with which the young are to be drawn to morality." -Spurgeon, on verses 11-12$
- Fearing the Lord can be taught as others listen to us, and \_\_\_\_\_, as people look at our lives.
- What is on the tip of the tongue springs from the habits of the heart (verse 13).
- $\Rightarrow$  Your heart is always moving somewhere. It must incessantly depart from evil and pursue good (verse 14).
