$\stackrel{\wedge}{\boxtimes}$	David took his turn watching for enemies as he fled in the wilderness,	
	using that quiet time for meditation.	
	We cling to the Lord only to find that he is the one	
	us along the way.	
$\stackrel{\wedge}{\boxtimes}$	Cling refers to the attachment of a close personal relationship.	
Back to life's struggle (63:9-11)		
	David did not believe that ignorance was bliss. He understood real	
	, but also knew that he needed the Lord to face them.	
	He prayed specifically against his enemies who were spreading	
	falsehood.

	David knew the Lord sustained him from birth and wanted that	
	strength up to old age, according to Psalm 71.
