By the Grace of God

Titus 2:11-12

*For the **grace** – divine ability
of God has appeared, – in the person and work of Jesus
Christ*

- 1. bringing salvation to all men – which you have received*
- 2. **Grace** is . . . **instructing** us – child training
 - blessing us when we yield*
 - chastening us when we disobey*. . . to **deny** ungodliness and worldly desires . . . as young women in regard to
 - loving your husbands*
 - loving your children*
 - being sensible, self-controlled, discreet*
 - being pure*
 - being workers at home*
 - being kind**

The phrase “worldly desires” refers to all improper desires pertaining to this life – the desire of wealth, pleasure, honor, sensual indulgence. It refers to such passions as the people of this world are prone to, and would include all those things which cannot be indulged in with a proper reference to the world to come. The gross passions would be of course included, and all those more refined pleasures also which constitute the characteristic and special enjoyments of those who do not live unto God.
