(1 John 4:16)


His kindness was perfectly displayed in His Son, our Savior.

The Meaning of Kindness

Dictionary Meaning of Kindness

- Affection, benevolence, courtesy, grace, favor, mercy. Root word has meaning of mercy, pity, good deeds, lovingkindness. Translated in our Bible: gracious, gentle, mellow, good, better, easy.
- Psalm 145:7, 17 The Lord is righteous in all His ways, and kind in all His deeds. Psalm 31:19, 106:1, 107:1 Not speaking of God's moral goodness, but His kindness to us relationally. Kindness fits under the large umbrella of love.

 Matthew 11:30 For My yoke is easy and My burden
 is light. The word easy means; well suited, fit, not
 abusive, adaptable, soothing.

Teaching Our Children to be Kind as We Endeavor to be Kind

Through an understanding of God's Word

Kindness is not natural.

There is none righteous . . . none who seeks for God . . . there is none who does good (or is kind). (Romans 3:11-12)

 Jesus says, Why callest thou me good? There is none good but one, that is God. (Matthew 19:17-18, KJV)

Be Ye Kind

It is a command.

For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works. (Ephesians 2:10)

- Titus is full of exhortations to be kind.
- Biblical Examples of Kindness: Dorcas, was abounding with deeds of kindness and charity which she continually did (Acts 9:36); Proverbs 31:26

Remember ARMSS

Affection

Be devoted to one another in brotherly love, give preference to one another in honor . . . contributing to the needs of the saints, practicing hospitality. (Romans 12:10-16)

Respect

We know love by this, that He laid down His life for us; and we ought to lay down our lives for the brethren. But whoever has the world's goods, and sees his brother in need and closes his heart against him, how does the love of God abide in him? Little children, let us not love with word or with tongue, but in deed and truth. (1 John 3:16-18)

Material Need

Have brotherly kindness. (1 John 4:7-17)

Sympathy

Summed up Peter says, be harmonious, sympathetic . . . not returning evil for evil . . . Do Good. (1 Peter 3:8-11)

Sensitivity

Sincere love of the brethren, fervently love one another from the heart. (1 Peter 1:22)

By Application

Esteem Kindness: It is a godly characteristic.

A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you... By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another. (John 13:34-35)

Be Kind to Everyone.

But love your enemies, and do good, and lend, expecting nothing in return; and your reward will be great, and you will be sons of the Most High; for He Himself is kind to <u>ungrateful</u> and <u>evil</u> men. (Luke 6:33-35)

- Let Kindness Reign—even when it would be natural to take offense. (Ephesians 4:32; Colossians 3:12-14)
- Kindness includes Forgiving. (1 Peter 4:8)
- Be Kind Parents. (Ephesians 6:4-7)

Challenges to Kindness

- The Flesh—sinfulness and self-absorption
- Time—responsibilities and pleasures
- Distractions—the world and all its allurements
- Our Tongue

Prayer

Our great example, Jesus, spent much time in prayer.

But Jesus Himself would often slip away to the wilderness and pray. (Luke 5:16)

Priorities

¹⁷Instruct those who are rich in this present world not to be conceited or to fix their hope on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly supplies us with all things to enjoy. ¹⁸Instruct them to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share, ¹⁹storing up for themselves the treasure of a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is life indeed. (I Timothy 6:17-19)

Plans: Yielded to God

So teach us to number our days, that we may present to You a heart of wisdom. (Psalm 90:12)

Power: Empowered by the Holy Spirit

Only by the empowering of the Holy Spirit Romans 15:13; Ephesians 5:1,2 Help from above; Hebrews 4:15 For we do not have a high priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but One who has been tempted in all things as we are, yet without sin; 1 Corinthians 9:8; 2 Corinthians 12:9
