## What is the duty which God requires of mankind?

He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the LORD require of you but to do justice, to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God (NASB; Micah 6:8).

Samuel said, "Has the LORD as much delight in burnt offerings and sacrifices as in obeying the voice of the LORD? Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice, *and* to heed than the fat of rams. For rebellion is as the sin of divination, and insubordination is as iniquity and idolatry" (NASB; I Sam. 15:22-23a).

## The duty which God requires of mankind is obedience to His revealed will.

(Westminster Shorter Catechism, Q. 39)

It is man's duty to obey God. The reason for this is that God is the creator and man is a mere creature. Because God created man, He therefore has "a right" to require what He will from man. Because man is only a creature, he has "no right" to "go his own way and do his own will." No, the only "right" for man is to obey God (G. I. Williamson).
