

## How is God related to all other things?

Worthy are you, <u>our Lord and our God</u>, to receive glory and honor and power; for <u>You created all things</u>, and because of Your will they existed and were created (NASB; Rev. 4:11).

He [God's Son] is before all things, and in Him all things hold together (NASB; Col. 1:17; cf. Heb. 1:3).

... He who is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords (NASB; I Tim. 6:15).

He does according to His will in the host of heaven and *among* the inhabitants of earth; and no one can ward off His hand or say to Him, "What have you done?" (NASB; Dan. 4:35).

God is related to all other things as their Creator, Sustainer, and Sovereign. He does by them, for them, or upon them whatever He pleases, and in doing so He is most holy in all his counsels, in all His

works, and in all His commands.
