1. *How did you teach your child AND YOURSELF contentment with his singleness?*

It takes much prayer and adjusting of our spirits to remain content because the natural man is restless and unsatisfied.

“The truth is that no external feature or circumstance keeps someone single or gets him married. The marital status of each of God’s children is divinely decreed. And if God has called you to singleness, there is nothing you can do without stepping off the path of obedience to change that.”

“If you are single it’s because for the time being at least, God has determined that you will most glorify Him & come to enjoy Him most fully as a single. If the time comes when these two ends will be achieved through marriage, God will change your life so you will be married.”

Contentment can't occur until knowledge of His control is blended with an equal understanding that His sovereignty is governed by His love for us. When we get a grip of God's sovereignty, and believe that His will is for our own good and more importantly, His glory, this will lead to contentment.

1 Corinthians 7:7 . . . *each man has his own gift from God; one in this manner, and another in that.*

Romans 8:32 *He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things?*

4. *What did you mothers of sons do to challenge your young man to “find a wife?”*

If you have had an opportunity to spend time with a godly young lady, take it as a gift, but hold it loosely in your hand, allowing God to either remove that gift, or confirm it.

Genesis 2:18 *It is not good for the man to be alone.*

Proverbs 18:22 *He who finds a wife finds a good thing.*

5. *How do you respond to a potential suitor?
How do you stop an unwanted relationship?*

When we have had to say no to a young man, I have tried to encourage him that I will pray for him in the coming year to be greatly blessed by the Lord—and that he should keep seeking the Lord’s will in another direction.
