Scriptural Commands to Govern All Relationships

- Love your neighbor as yourself (Matthew 22:39)
- Do good to all people (Galatians 6:10)
- Do not merely look out for your own personal interests, but also for the interests of others (Philippians 2:4)
- Be patient with everyone (I Thessalonians 5:14)
- Honor all people (I Peter 2:17)

Relationships with Siblings

- A. God's view of siblings in Scripture
 - 1. Uses family relationships as His ideal for relationships in His church

2. Openly records the failures in many sibling relationships

- B. Our sibling relationships in the light of God's providence
 - 1. God's providential choice of our siblings (Psalm 139:15-16; Job 23:14)

2. God's providential use of these relationships for good (Genesis 45:4-8; 50:19, 20; Romans 8:28)

Relationships with Nieces and Nephews

A. Delight in these relationships as God's special gifts to you.



B. Seek to be a godly influence and encourage their spiritual interest.

That the generation to come might know, even the children yet to be born, that they may arise and tell them to their children, that they should put their confidence in God and not forget the works of God, but keep His commandments. (Psalm 78:4, 6-7)

D. Admonish one another (Romans 15:14; Colossians 3:16)


E. Serve one another (Galatians 5:13, I Peter 4:10)
