- Purposes of physical intimacy
 - Procreation
 - Pleasure and joy
 - Closeness and oneness
 - Protection from temptation
- Scriptural directives
 - Commanded
 - No rights
 - No options
 - Initiation by either partner
- Insights
 - Recognize your husband's "danger signals"
 - Concentrate on pleasing him
 - Be creative
 - Be a lover, not a roommate
 - Stay rested and fit
 - Plan to faithfully meet his needs
 - Communicate
 - Pray for your husband to remain pure

Realize that by God's design, you are the only appropriate outlet for your husband's desires. Anything you deny him becomes, by definition, an absolute denial, because he has no other place to which he can go to find satisfaction in a healthy or holy manner.
