<b>Week 9—Isaiah 53:10 (to be quoted on February 11)</b>

<i><b>12</b> Therefore will I divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he hath poured out his soul unto death: and he was numbered with the transgressors; and <b>he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.</b></i>	<i><b>12</b> Therefore, I will allot Him portion with the great, and He will divide the booty with the strong; because He poured out Himself to death, and was numbered with the transgressors; <b>Yet He Himself bore the sin of many, and interceded for the transgressors.</b></i>	<i><b>12</b> Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; <b>yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.</b></i>
